Your Music Department presents an **interactive student performance experience** and Seminar/Q&A with singer/composer Mark Arthur Miller and his co-arranger, conductor and pianist, Peter Smith.

Do you know who wrote For Once in My Life? It wasn't Stevie Wonder!

In his sizzling hot multi-media concert experience, <u>Soul Searching</u>, Mark Arthur Miller takes a high-energy dive into the Detroit sound **and the music of his father**, **Motown hitmaker Ron Miller**, composer of the classic "For Once in My Life" and more iconic



favorites including "A Place in the Sun," "Yester-me, Yester-you, Yester-day," "Heaven Help Us All," "Touch Me in the Morning," "Someday at Christmas," "Don't Burn Down the Bridge" and many more.

Ron, the first white composer at Motown, was personally hired by Motown founder Berry Gordy when Gordy heard Ron playing his original music in a bar room in Chicago. The show is full of unforgettable songs from Miller's repertoire, as well as additional hits from The Temptations, Smokey Robinson, Otis Redding and more, plus Mark Arthur Miller and Peter Smith originals.

Now, your music department has the opportunity to participate in an interactive concert experience with Mark Arthur Miller and his co-arranger, conductor and pianist, Peter Smith. Using Peter Smith's orchestrations for a 6-piece band plus two background vocalists, Miller and Smith will conduct and perform with your students in a concert performance of *Soul Searching*.

This experience plays out over the course of 2-3 days (flexible and TBD) including one band rehearsal with vocalists and a separate vocalist rehearsal. Your students will experience what it's like to receive new arrangements and ready themselves for a

performance with limited prep time and rehearsal. They will be playing some of the most rich and beloved music in the contemporary American Songbook. In addition, the music department has the opportunity to attend a **prepared seminar/Q&A** on Ron Miller/Motown with Mark Arthur Miller and Peter Smith:

Ron Miller at Motown and the Genesis of Soul Searching the Show and CD.

COST AND TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

COST: \$7500.00 plus T&E if applicable.

Includes:

1 full rehearsal with band and vocals

1 separate vocal rehearsal

1 technical/sound check

Loan of music charts and mp3s for student musicians

1 separate event: Seminar and Q&A

Like a music assignment, the students will receive the charts and live mp3s at least a month in advance to learn.

PLEASE NOTE: We are happy to accommodate several players for each instrument. While the working band will remain 5 student musicians and 2 student singers, the intermission would provide an opportunity to switch out players and singers. All players and singers would be required to learn music in advance and attend rehearsals.

MEET MARK ARTHUR MILLER AND PETER SMITH

Mark Arthur Miller: Singer/Songwriter, Actor, Director, Educator



Smokey Robinson and The Miracles, Stevie Wonder, The Temptations, Jr. Walker and the All Stars, Marvin Gaye...these artists were the soundtrack of Mark Arthur Miller's young life growing up on Chicago's South Side. Raised by his mother and grandparents at 87th and King and separated from his father, songwriter Ron Miller, the family remained in the neighborhood as so-called "white flight" to the suburbs changed it from white to black. A goldmine of cultural experience was the result.

Less than three hundred miles away in Detroit, Ron Miller was writing the kind of music Mark describes as "my DNA." But at that point, estranged from his son for over 10 years, Ron Miller was just a name on the label of a 45rpm record.

Mark and his sister reconnected with the elder Miller and moved to Los Angeles with him when Motown relocated there. A lifelong bond was formed, and through Ron's work Mark frequently found himself in the company of idols Stevie, Smokey, Marvin, Diana and more. Once Ron Miller realized his son's singing talent, he would often have Mark sing demos of his songs.

Mark focused on acting when he moved back to Chicago at age 21. He was a cofounder Reflections Theatre Ensemble there and eventually returning to Los Angeles, he co-founded The Road Theater Company. Mark has appeared in shows from coast to coast including *The Rainmaker, Once upon a Mattress, Bus Stop, The Elephant Man, Rhinoceros, Tartuffe, Medal of Honor Rag, Private Wars, 5th of July, Torch Song Trilogy, The Woolgatherer, The Rimers of Eldritch, Balm in Gilead, Look back in Anger, Barefoot in the Park, among others. He has appeared in numerous television shows and films. Music, however, has always had the #1 place in his heart. He began performing in popular venues including Rockwell Table and Stage, The Federal, The Cinegrill, and Catalina Jazz, L.A.'s premiere jazz venue. In New York, he has performed at The Triad and GreenRoom42. Mark has received, without exception, RAVE reviews.*

Mark's album, SOUL SEARCHING, has found its way onto playlists on radio all over the world. Naturally, it features some Ron Miller hits as well as originals by Mark Arthur Miller and other classic Motown songs.

Peter Smith: Pianist, Composer, Arranger, Songwriter, and Music Director, Educator



An accomplished pianist, composer, arranger, songwriter, and music director, and his career has flourished on both coasts. Originally a New Yorker, Peter has lived in Los Angeles since 2005.

Recent projects include the release of his latest jazz trio recording, "Dollar Dreams," as well as a series of video releases from the "Highland Park House Band."

Peter was an associate Music Director for both seasons of *The Four* on Fox and the associate Music Director on *Duets*, the hit singing competition show on ABC. working directly with Kelly

Clarkson, Jennifer Nettles, Robin Thicke and John Legend, accompanying them and their contestants in rehearsal, and collaborating with them on the musical arrangements for the show. His compositions can be heard on numerous TV shows (*Mindy Project, CSI, Bones, Arrow, Bojack-Horseman, Young Sheldon, Benched, Supergirl, Growing Up Fisher, Black Lightning, Pitch, Charmed, How to Live With Your Parents*) as well as in the films *Hotel Noir, Myth of Fingerprints*, and *Bleached*. He has been traveling the world as **Molly Ringwald**'s pianist/MD, serving as co-producer and arranger on her Concord Records release: <u>Except Sometimes</u>.

Peter is music director for Ty Taylor's project: <u>The Nouveau Mid Century Romance Songbook</u>, which debuted at the Wallis in LA. Peter is co-producer /collaborator (with Rob Perkins and Ty Taylor) as well as pianist and arranger for the album of the same title, which will be released by Universal Music Group.

In 2009, Peter released his debut jazz album: <u>Here It Comes</u>, which featured a mix of original material and standard repertoire. He followed it up with an ambitious live project: <u>Blues At Alvas</u>.

Peter Smith attended Columbia University, and was a DJ at the acclaimed radio station at WKCR, where he interviewed many of the great pianists in New York and attended the "Jazz University" of historian Phil Schaap.

An accomplished actor as well, Peter's career has brought him many roles on the small screen in shows like *Law and Order*, *24*, *Scandal*, *Weeds*, *CSI*, and many more. Peter has also performed on Broadway, Off-Broadway and Regional stages. Combining his experiences in acting and music, he has written a screenplay about jazz pianist Bill Evans during his time with Miles Davis. The script, *Blue in Green*, has received much acclaim in the industry and is inching its way towards production.



FRONT OF STAGE

Lighting and Projection Requirements: Venue should have ability to plug in a(n Apple) laptop and project stills and onto a screen. **Production provides a HDMI Plug to go into venue's projection equipment**, Please provide exact equipment in-house and the size of screen and throw distance from the source of projection.

Stage lighting: A lighting design and cues will be sent upon booking, with suggestions based on the venues capabilities

Labor Requirements: One (1) House "Stage Manager" One (1) Lighting Operator One (1) Audio Operator One (1) Projection Operator (or the lighting operator or stage manager can handle projections)

Sound-check/ Tech Rehearsal: A 2-3 hour sound-check/rehearsal is required prior to the show, and to be concluded at least 90 minutes prior to curtain. Lead and background vocals can be in ear monitors or stage monitors depending on venues equipment and capabilities.

Performers will go "cue to cue" with the lighting, projection and audio operators prior to show as needed, to insure that the lighting cues, the projections are all in place and running smoothly.

Backstage Requirements:

1) dressing rooms

One large dressing room or two small dressing rooms are required and should have cold/hot water sinks, shower(s), and be furnished in a comfortable fashion. Hand towels should be provided in the dressing rooms.

2) green room

Venue should provide a green room or additional dressing room with comfortable seating and enough surface space for performers to eat meals, relax, etc.

3) food/refreshments

Venue should provide several bottles of water, or filtered water and glasses. Performers require a bottle of water each onstage during the show. Tea/coffee (herbal and black tea) should be provided back stage with sugar, honey and whole milk, as well as a fruit plate and light snacks, nuts, etc (no cheese).

4) meals

Dinner should be provided immediately after sound check, and no less than 90 minutes prior to curtain. If dinner is catered, please provide a no-cheese/cream option.
